Jerash, the Gerasa of Antiquity is the largest city of Jerash Governorate, which is situated in the north of Jordan, 30 miles north of the capital Amman. Jerash has developed dramatically in the last century with the growing importance of the tourism industry to the city. Jerash is now the second-most popular tourist attraction in Jordan, closely behind the splendid ruins of Petra. The ruins have been carefully preserved and spared from encroachment, with the modern city sprawling to the west of ancient Jerash's city walls.

The Jerash Festival of Culture and Arts is an annual celebration of Arabic and international culture during the summer months. The festival site is located within the ancient ruins of Jerash, some of which date to the Roman age (63 BC). Jerash Festival is a festival which features poetry recitals, theatrical performances, concerts and other forms of art.

How To Get There ▶

The site now lies on a modern highway that links Amman with the northern boundary of the Kingdom towards Syria; the drive takes 40 minutes from Amman at a leisurely speed. As you approach, it is after a corner of the highway that you are suddenly faced with a wonderful view of the ruins, with the Triumphal Arch in the foreground. On the other side of the highway lies the modern town of Jerash.

Charles E. Stallworth II, Assistant Commissioner
U.S. Customs and Border Protection Department of Homeland Security, United States

Charles E. Stallworth II assumed the position of Assistant Commissioner of International Affairs for Customs and Border Protection (CBP) within the Department of Homeland Security on March 10, 2013. Under his leadership and direction, the Office of International Affairs implements programs and initiatives that promote anti-terrorism, global border security, non-proliferation, export controls, immigration and capacity building. The office also provides countries with training and advisory support for broad-based customs reform, border management, and modernization; and ensures CBP is represented at key embassies influencing policy throughout the world. Between 2005 and 2013, Mr. Stallworth served in several other leadership positions in the Office of International Affairs, to include Acting Assistant Commissioner, Deputy Assistant

Commissioner, Executive Director of the Training and Assistance Division, and the Executive Director of the Foreign Operations Division. The Training and Assistance Division provided short and long-term assistance in areas of border management, law enforcement and infrastructure-building, while the Foreign Operations Division was responsible for establishing a CBP presence in U.S. Embassies and Consulates and sustaining the extended border strategy of CBP. Before joining the U.S. Customs Service, Mr. Stallworth spent over 25 years in the United States Air Force, ultimately reaching the rank of Colonel. Mr. Stallworth received his Bachelor of Science degree in economics from the United States Air Force Academy (USAFA) and his Juris Doctorate from the University of the Pacific, McGeorge School of Law. Colonel Stallworth retired from the USAF as a command pilot with more than 3,600 flying hours in the T-37, T-38, F-111, and F-16 aircraft. His military decorations and awards include: the Legion of Merit, the Meritorious Service Medal with four oak leaf clusters, the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, the NATO medal, the Air Force Commendation Medal, the Air Force Achievement Medal, the Combat Readiness Medal, with one oak leaf cluster, and National Defense Service Medal, with one oak leaf cluster.

Dennis Cosgrove, Head (Border Security & Management Unit), Transnational Threats Department, Organization for Security and Co-operation in Europe (OSCE), Republic of Austria

Dennis T. Cosgrove assumed the position of the Head of Border Security and Management Unit, Transnational Threats Department, in December 2013. Prior to his current assignment, he served as the United States Embassy's Senior Law Enforcement Advisor in the Republic of Tajikistan from 2010-2013. From 2008-2009, Mr. Cosgrove was the Senior Program Advisor for the United States Department of Justice, International Criminal Investigative Training Assistance Program (ICITAP) in the Republic of Montenegro. Mr. Cosgrove retired from the U.S. Federal Bureau of Investigation at the end of 2007, after 22 years. He has served in a number of FBI Field Office Divisions to include, Kansas City, San Francisco and Tampa. Mr. Cosgrove also worked internationally for the FBI, serving in FBI Legal Attaché offices and on special assignment in Russia, Kazakhstan, Iraq, Greece, Hungary and Moldova. He has investigated a wide variety of criminal violations to include public corruption, white collar crime, transnational organized crime, drug trafficking and terrorism. He is a graduate of the United States Merchant Marine Academy and earned his Juris Doctorate degree from New York Law School. He is licensed to practice law in New York, New Jersey and Florida and is a FBI certified Russian linguist.

Col Morabito Giuseppe, Director, North Atlantic Treaty Organisation (NATO), Middle East Faculty, NATO Defense College, Italian Republic

Colonel Giuseppe MORABITO was born in Rome on 3rd December 1959. In 1978, he attended the 160th Course of the Military Academy in Modena graduating as a Second Lieutenant in 1980. In 1982, after completing two years at the School of Applied Military Studies in Turin he was promoted to First Lieutenant. Colonel MORABITO spent most of his operational career in the Bersaglieri units (Italian Light Infantry), serving as a Platoon Commander and then as a Company Commander in 1st Bersaglieri Regiment in Aurelia (Rome). Between 1992 and 1995, he successfully attended the 117th Senior Course of the Italian Staff College in Civitavecchia and the 1st Italian Joint Staff College Course. He then moved to Italian Army General Staff in Rome (1995-1998) as staff officer in the international training branch. From February to July 1997 he attended the 90th Senior Course at the NATO Defense College in Rome. From 1998-1999 he commanded the 17th Infantry Regiment, after which he served as the Chief of Staff in the Granatieri di Sardegna Brigade in Rome (1999-2003). During this period he participated in the missions in Albania, as Chief of Staff of KFOR-COMMZ (W) (2000) and as Chief of Staff of the NATO Headquarters Tirana - NHQT (2002). After his promotion to the rank of Colonel, he commanded the Sergeants School of the Italian Army in Cassino (2003) and participated in the Joint Force Operation in Bosnia Herzegovina, as SFOR Deputy Chief of Staff for Operation (from January to October 2004). On 22nd February 2005, he was appointed Faculty Adviser and Senior Italian Representative at the NATO Defense College. From June 2008 to June 2012 he was the Chief of the NDC Field Studies Branch. Colonel MORABITO is currently assigned to NATO Defense College, as Director of the Middle East Faculty. Strategic Science graduate at Turin University (1999) and International and Diplomatic Science graduate from Trieste University (2005). H.E. Ambassador Bruno Saccomani (CEGEP, Dawson College, Montreal, 1979) has had a varied career serving with the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP). Mr. Saccomani began his career in 1985 as a Criminal Investigator in British Columbia. He also held positions in the RCMP Drugs Section and as a Senior Investigator before being assigned to the Prime Minister's Security Detail in Ottawa in 1996. Following an assignment as Special Investigator in the Immigration and Passport Division, Mr. Saccomani was promoted to the commissioned rank of Inspector and Prime Minister's Travel Officer. Mr. Saccomani has served abroad as an Assistant Liaison Officer in both Italy and Thailand. In addition, he has been involved in many major international projects including coordinating police activities in preparation for a G8 Summit in Italy and working with diverse international partners to provide a cohesive security response following the events of September 11, 2001 in the United States. From 2009 - 2013, Mr. Saccomani was the Officer in Charge of the Prime Minister's Protection Detail. In 2013, he was named Canada's Ambassador to the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan and to the Republic of Iraq.

Andrew Harper, Country representative, United Nations High Commissioner For Refugees (UNHCR) Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan

For the past three years Andrew has been responsible for leading and coordinating the international refugee response to the Syrian Crisis in Jordan, as Representative of the UN High Commissioner for Refugees. Some of the main achievements of the operation have been the establishment of the Zaatar and Azraq refugee camps and ensuring that over 600,000 Syrian refugees who have fled to the safety of Jordan are provided with assistance and protection. Prior to coming to Jordan, Andrew was Head of Desk for UNHCR Headquarters in Geneva, covering the Iraq Situation for six years as well as being the Emergency Focal Point for the Middle East and North Africa region for the Libyan Crisis in 2011. He has served with the UN Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs as Head of Office in Sumatra following the 2004 Tsunami and as the Chief of Staff for the UN Recovery Coordinator for Aceh. Prior deployments with the UN Refugee Agency include West Timor, Ukraine/Crimea, Albania/Kosovo, Central Asia and Iran. He started his career overseas with the Australian Embassy in Turkey following the 1990 Iraq war. In 2014 Andrew was awarded the Member of the Order of Australia; he has also been the recipient of the 2013 ANZAC Peace Prize and the 2013 Sir Ron Wilson Human Rights Award. He is married with three young daughters.

Maj Gen (Retd) Mahmoud Morsi Strategic Military Lecturer /Member of Chatham House London, Arab Republic of Egypt

Maj. Gen. Mahmoud Morsi served as a chief of Air defence Reconnaissance Department at Egyptian Armed Forces over 30 years in positions of increasing responsibility within the Egyptian Armed Forces, encompassing the following areas: Head of Reconnaissance Department at Egyptian Army Air Defence headquarter Estimating and evaluating threats, battle damage assessments; defining targets, He also commanded Sam Air defence brigade and served in multiple leadership positions in operations, information operations, and planning. He attended The United States Army Command and General Staff College, Fort Leavenworth, Kansas 1996 /1997, Nasr Academy Defence College Egypt 2006 and Royal collage of defence studies RCDS London 2007 and worked as a Military observers of the UN mission Mozambique Rapid reaction team leader 1992 - 1993 Mahmoud has published on national security, radical of Islam and air power, worked on different papers related to national security and Middle East Currently Visiting Lecturer (Nasser Egyptian Military Academy) Defence College including Supervise variety of PHD and thesis's Geo Strategic, political, Economic and military consulting for many agencies and also a Member of Chatham house London His awards and decorations include the Order of Military Duty Medal, Long Service and the example Medal, The United Nations Medal. National Defence Medal and Army Achievement Medal

H.E. Caroline DUMAS, Ambassador Embassy of France, Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan

Caroline Dumas holds a Bachelor of Arts (English), Diploma of the Institute of Political Studies in Paris and the written Arabic degree from the National Institute of Oriental Languages and Civilizations. Joined the Department of Foreign Affairs in 1985, she first worked in Paris on development projects in Africa, then the Near East in the direction of North Africa and the Middle East. It then passes to the American direction. She became first secretary in Pretoria (South Africa) in 1990 and first counselor in Nairobi (Kenya) in 1993. Back in Paris in 1997, she is responsible for cultural, scientific and technical in the Middle East, before taking the head of the Department of Northern and Middle East Africa to the General Directorate of International Cooperation and Development. She was then

appointed Counsellor for cooperation and cultural action in Madrid (Spain) from 2000 to 2003. After spending a year at Harvard University as 'Fellow Researcher', becomes first counselor at the Embassy of France in Washington between 2004 and 2006. Deputy Director of Africa and the Indian Ocean in Paris between 2006 and 2009, she was appointed extraordinary and plenipotentiary ambassador to Reykjavik (Iceland) in 2009, before returning to the Directorate of North Africa and the Middle East Paris late 2011. She was appointed ambassador of France in Jordan, by order of the President of the French Republic on 28 January 2013.

Abdulaziz Obaidalla, Assistant Director NCB Co-ordination Sub-Directorate for MENA, International Criminal Police Organization, INTERPOL, French Republic

Obaidalla Abdulaziz is a seconded officer from United Arab Emirates to work as Assistant Director for Middle East and North Africa. Abdulaziz graduated from the Dubai Police Academy with Bachelors degree in Law and Police since, then joined the criminal investigations department in the Dubai Police and worked in several positions before joining Interpol in 2009.

The Honourable Jay Grant, Secretary General Interport Police, United States (US)

Hon. Jay Grant was appointed as the Director on September 10, 2010 and serves as the 5th Secretary General of the 45 year old police organisation. His prior positions include that as director of the U.S. Airport and Seaport Police and U.S. Port Security Council where his activities included national coordination and intergovernmental affairs for airport and seaport law enforcement and public safety with the Department of Homeland Security, Department of Justice and U.S. Congress in the aftermath of 9/11. The Director has been a visible leader for transportation security. His work in law enforcement and public safety issues are numerous and include collaboration with the United States Congress, assisting in appropriating billions of dollars for public port security transportation authority programs. Current projects include focus on key technology in support of aviation CCTV, perimeter security and facial recognition constituting over 100 million dollars in current agency requirements; and the use of technology for secure collaboration among agencies and officers in support of the SRMX portal. His work with port authorities and governments on security and law enforcement policy, intelligence and operational issues include security grants, passage of airport, seaport and border legislation, pilot programs and operational security evaluations. The pursuit of international policy and cooperation for aviation, maritime and transport security has been a priority. His earlier work includes Washington Legislative Counsel for the State of Arkansas, Office of the Governor. He was a federal counsel to state governments, intergovernmental and non-government organizations before Congress, legislatures and agencies. From July 2008 - Jan 2009, as private secretary to Minister of State and Foreign Secretary, he was head of the Private Office for the FCO Minister of State before spending time serving as Private Secretary to the Foreign Secretary. From Jan 2005 - July 2008, he was Policy Lead on CT and Strategic Threats, British Embassy, Washington DC and functioned as a Intelligence policy lead between the US and UK. Between May 2002 - Dec 2004, he was the 3rd Secretary Political, British High Commission, Belize. He provided political reporting and conducted lobbying on the Belize Government on a range of issues, including the Belize/Guatemala dispute, drugs and human rights. Specific responsibility for political and counter narcotics reporting, analysis for HMG, and management of Conflict Prevention programmes. From Dec 2000 - 2002, as Desk Officer, Environment Policy Department, FCO, he provided policy advice on a range of nuclear related issues. From Aug 1994 - Dec 2000, he was a Police Officer, Lothian and Borders Police, Edinburgh & served for seven years as a policeman in range of uniform and plain clothes duties including rapid response units, firearms officer, sudden death inquiries squad, and community officer.
